


Cost: \$330 (Two week camp - July 20 - 31)

MINECRAFT 2



Additional Camp Options

BEFORE AND AFTER CAMP CARE

Extended camp sessions are available in the morning from 8:15 - 9:15am, and in the afternoon from 3:00 - 4:00pm. Before and After Camp Care is offered for \$50 per week per session (morning or afternoon), or \$100 per week for both morning and afternoon sessions. Registration is available through our CampDoc registration system. Supervision is provided by one of our camp teachers. Daily Before and After Camp Care is available for \$15/session (am or pm) if available - *** please note that our care program will only run if there are pre-registered campers for that week. Please contact us at cranburyartscouncil@gmail.com to arrange daily care and to confirm the program is running that week.

LUNCH PROGRAM

Half-day campers may extend their day with lunch care from 11:45 - 12:30pm. Registration is available for \$50 per week through our CampDoc registration system. Campers MUST bring their own lunches. Note: Lunch supervision is included for full-day campers only. Full-day campers should not register for lunch care.

This program is also available for children attending the Cranbury School ESY and Summer Academy Program. The cost is \$50 per week, and this option may be selected during registration through our CampDoc system. Our staff will meet the children participating in the ESY and Summer Academy Programs and walk them down to our supervised lunch area.

You may register for our Before and After Camp Care and/or Lunch Care, when you register for camp. You may also add this option at a later date.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

<u>Online registration</u>: Registration will be completed through CampDoc.com, and payments by credit card or electronic check will be processed by Docnetwork LLC. Full registration instructions are posted on our website.

For security purposes, CampDoc's registration program uses current and major-release versions of most browsers (Chrome, Firefox, Edge, Safari). Older versions of these browsers, and Internet Explorer, may not work. For more information, you may visit CampDoc's browser page.

<u>Payments:</u> Full payment is due at registration. A \$25 per camp cancellation fee will be charged for all canceled registrations.

<u>Registration deadline</u>: The regular registration deadline is 5/31/2020. A non-refundable late registration fee of \$25 per camper will be charged for enrollment after that date (new registrations and registration for additional camps). Registrations for open camps are accepted up through the first day of each camp.

Cancellation, refunds, and camp changes

- Registrations canceled before 6/1/2020 will receive a 100% refund, less a \$25 per camp cancellation fee.
- Registrations canceled between 6/1/2020 and 7/1/2020 will receive a 50% refund, less a \$25 per camp cancellation fee. No refunds will be given after 7/1/2020. Refunds of tuition for a documented emergency or unavoidable change of circumstances (e.g. serious medical issue, job relocation) may be given at our discretion.
- Camps may be switched if needed up through 7/1/2020, as long as space is available. To avoid incurring cancellation fees, registration in the new camp(s) must be completed within 3 days of submission of a cancellation request for the original camp(s).
- If CAC cancels a camp, a full refund will be given if no suitable alternative camp is available.

<u>Waiting lists</u>: Waiting lists will be automatically generated during the registration process if a camp fills. You may also contact us to have your child placed on a waiting list. If an opening becomes available, the space will be offered to wait-listed children in the order received.

<u>Scholarships</u>: Full and partial need-based scholarships are available. Please email the Cranbury Arts Council at cranburyartscouncil@gmail.com to request a scholarship form. Need-based scholarships for Musical Theater Workshop must be requested and received before 1/25/2020. Notification of scholarship decisions will be emailed to the applicant on or before 2/1/2020. Need-based scholarships for all other 2020 summer camps must be requested and received before 4/1/2020. Notification of scholarship decisions will be emailed to applicants on or before 4/7/2020. If you have been approved for a need-based full or partial scholarship, you will receive a code to use during the registration process through our CampDoc registration system.


